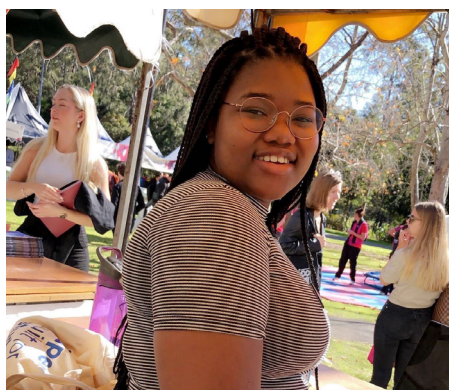
Georgia is currently completing a Bachelor of Midwifery at UTS.
