The video was created with the support and expertise of Melissa Slattery (Walsh, 1977) and Rebecca Baillie (1989). In addition, a highlights video was put together and we were pleased to share a short extract at the School's Birthday Assembly and the full version at the Gala Evening as well as at the Central and Western Districts Reunion. I understand there are a number of you who missed out on the opportunity to see the video and we are investigating options of how we can make this available.

### Kathleen McCredie turns 90

It was with much delight the AOGU celebrated the 90th birthday of Miss Kathleen McCredie AM in August. Miss McCredie was the first (and so far, only) Abbotsleigh Old Girl to return as Headmistress (1970-1987). She was a pupil at Abbotsleigh from 1940-1945 and also a Prefect.

During Miss McCredie's term as Headmistress, facilities improved considerably with new science laboratories, a library extension, extra classrooms, a language laboratory and a beautiful Year 12 Common Room. In 1983, the Centenary Building was officially opened and in 1990, the McCredie House boarding house was opened in her honour.

While she saw Abbotsleigh as always having had a strong academic reputation, this wasn't enough for Miss McCredie. She saw it as being all those intangibles – the search after truth, the encouragement to think, to use initiative, to develop responsible attitudes, to serve others, to discipline ourselves, to have fun, to be happy, to be enthusiastic for work and all those activities that help girls to develop spiritually, mentally, physically, socially – and all of this would help to further school spirit.

During the celebrations, Old Girls who had Miss McCredie as their headmistress commented they had been 'so lucky' describing her as 'an inspiration', 'well-loved' and 'a brilliant and visionary educator'.
