The girls' performances were absolutely sublime. Indeed, our girls, our music staff and musicians, led so beautifully by Mrs Lynette Clarke, were nothing short of sensational. It was a great delight and privilege for all those who attended to be in the audience and celebrate Abbotsleigh's 140th Birthday and the superb talents of our girls in Years 5-12, our 'stars', at the beautiful Sydney Opera House.

From the first moment when our First Nations girls delivered their poignant Acknowledgement of Country through voice and dance, through to the final crescendo of celebration in the 'Hallelujah Chorus' performed by every girl, the audience was both mesmerised and awestruck as they were wowed by the marvellous performances of our ensembles – jazz, brass, our vocalists, percussionists, symphonic winds, rock band, the Junior School, Senior School and chamber choirs, camerata, our symphony orchestra, and the whole school choir, to name but a few.

We were honoured to welcome world-renowned didgeridoo player and composer William Barton as our special guest, who played the didgeridoo for our whole school performance of 'The Arafura' by Dan Walker. We also were incredibly grateful to our special guest artist, Little Green, (Amy Nelson, AOG 2017), whose performance with our singers, dancers and musicians were excellent.

We also were honoured to welcome and acknowledge special guest, Mrs Robyn Claydon, at our matinée performance. Mrs Claydon was a much-loved former Deputy Headmistress (1973-1990) and Acting Chaplain (2014), who wrote the lyrics to the School Song, 'To Abbotsleigh', in 1975 for the School's 90th Birthday celebrations. The genuine and spontaneous applause, appreciation and respect given to Mrs Claydon by all our girls, staff and the audience was incredibly moving.

Another highlight of many, and showcasing our prefect theme, 'Bee Connected', was the world premiere performance of our Composer-in-Residence, Dr Harry Sdraulig's, unique composition and gift to the School, 'The Hive's Caper', which reflects the intricacies and activities of a beehive. Further highlights included the performance of Piano Concerto in A minor, 1st Movement by virtuosa pianist, Scarlet Li, and the performance of Verano Proteño by virtuosa violinist, Jessica Ma.

The title of our 140th Anniversary Concert, 'Night of a Thousand Stars' was indeed most apt as we celebrated the thousands of young women, 'stars', who have loved music and who have passed through the hallways of Abbotsleigh throughout our school's rich tapestry woven over the last 140 years. It was an outstanding once in a lifetime event
