Wise Words

Boarders Chapel this term has been exploring practical wisdom as 'life hacks'. One of this week's examples was a cleaning hack using vinegar, bicarbonate of soda and lemon to reduce the need for scrubbing stubborn stains on dishes. But an even more powerful life hack was learning to be wise with our words. Clare from CRU spoke on how words can be like swords or Band-Aids – they can wound deeply or bring comfort and healing.
