MUSIC AT ABBOTSLEIGH

Abbotsleigh's Music programs are some of the most acclaimed, dynamic and vibrant programs in Sydney.

They comprise three core areas:

- 1. Classroom
- 2. Ensemble
- Instrumental (private music tuition is available to Abbotsleigh students as well as adult and external students).

Why learn an instrument?

Studies show that learning an instrument has huge benefits to the development of children and adults.

Learning an instrument:

- Improves cognitive processes including recall, abstract reasoning and language decoding
- Fosters creativity in concrete and abstract forms
- Develops social skills and fosters friendships outside age-specific groups
- Helps regulate emotions, relieve stress and build self-confidence
- Teaches patience and long-term goal setting, discipline and time management
- Gives a voice to personal expression and aesthetic
- ls fun!

Why choose Abbotsleigh Music?

- Convenience of lessons during the school day (selected lessons can take place before school, after school or on Saturdays) and instrument hire.



MUSIC TUITION PROGRAM

Lessons

- Learning an instrument is a longterm goal. Students are expected to commit to lessons for the whole calendar year.
- Lessons are taught throughout the day on a rotational basis to ensure that students do not miss the same classes each week.
- 3. Junior School students are offered 30-minute lessons only.
- Senior School students may enrol in 30-minute, 45-minute or 60-minute lessons, depending on the student's level and teacher's recommendation.
- Fixed lesson times must be approved by the Head of Junior School Music or the Head of Senior School Music and apply in the following circumstances:
 - When a student is learning multiple instruments, one instrument is scheduled during class time and the remaining lessons are fixed.
 - Junior School students approved for 45-minute lessons are scheduled at a fixed time outside school hours (only considered for students doing AMEB Grade 4 and above).
 - Senior School students approved for 60-minute lessons are scheduled at a fixed time outside of school hours.
 - Year 12 students are given a fixed lesson time.
 - In special circumstances the academic learning needs of a student requires music lessons to be scheduled outside class time.

- Fixed lessons take place before school, after school or at lunchtime.
- Fixed lessons are subject to teacher availability.

Fees

- 1. Lessons are charged in packages of eight per term. This allows music teachers the flexibility to schedule lessons around a student's timetable (excursions, school camps, assessments etc) as well as illness and medical appointments. As a result, students will sometimes not have a music lesson every week of the school term.
- 2. We aim for students to receive 32 lessons per year. After reaching a total of 32 lessons, there is an opportunity for extra lessons, if requested.
- 3. Fees are charged to your school account and must be paid at the start of each term.

Discontinuations

- All discontinuations require email notification to the Music Administrator: musicadmin@abbotsleigh.nsw.edu.au
- Lessons automatically roll over from term to term and year to year unless the Music Administrator is notified in writing that lessons are to be discontinued.
- 3. Cancellation of lessons is to be made four weeks prior to lessons stopping.
- 4. If notice is less than four weeks, a cancellation fee to the value of four lessons will be charged.
- 5. There is no refund of term fees.

Absences

- At least 24 hours' notice must be given to the music tutor if non-attendance at a lesson is to occur due to:
 - Illness
 - · School activity or event
 - Assessment
- 2. Notice must be given via email.
- 3. Make-up lessons are not provided for any other absence or if notice was given within 24 hours.

Instruments

- Students receiving private music lessons at school and/or playing in a school ensemble are eligible to hire an instrument from the school.
- 2. Requests for a hired instrument are to be emailed to the Music Administrator: musicadmin@abbotsleigh.nsw.edu.au
- The school's instrument loan agreement form must be signed and returned to the Music Administrator before an instrument can be released.
- 4. After two years of instrument hire, parents are expected to purchase an instrument for their daughter.

MUSICIANSHIP

- Musicianship lessons are offered to students in Senior School and are recommended to those playing an instrument.
- 2. Both group and private lessons are offered.
- Group lessons comprise 3-6 students. If the minimum number is not reached to form a class, students will need to have private lessons.
- Students wishing to enrol midway through a term may not be accommodated into group lessons and will need to enrol in private lessons.
- To enrol in Grade 1 musicianship, the student must be preparing for Grade 3 (or above) in their practical work.
- 6. To enrol for Grades 2-6 musicianship lessons, students must provide evidence of completion of the previous grade as a prerequisite of enrolment.
- Musicianship courses generally run in packages of 16 lessons (two eightlesson blocks per semester).
- 8. Students sit the AMEB examination online. Please note that examination

- fees incur a separate charge as per the AMEB guidelines/fees.
- In the case of non-attendance at a scheduled group lesson, it is the responsibility of the student to cover the missed content in their own time. There are no catch-up lessons offered for a missed group lesson.

ENROLMENTS

- To enrol your daughter in private music lessons, email your request to musicadmin@abbotsleigh.nsw.edu.au
- Your enrolment request will be assessed by the Music Administrator and a tutor will be allocated according to availability and the best fit for your daughter. You will be notified by email if your daughter has been placed on a waiting list.
- 3. Your child's instrumental teacher will contact you to arrange lesson times.
- 4. Hire instruments will be distributed at the first lesson with your tutor.

 Ongoing lessons are timetabled by the instrumental tutor each week.
 Timetables are emailed to students (or parents in Junior School), written in the student's Gold Book and posted on the Music Department noticeboard.

Students are expected to:

- Bring their instrument, music and Gold Book to each lesson
- Check their lesson time against their school commitments (excursions, assessments etc)
- Email their instrumental tutor if there are any issues with their weekly lesson time.

SENIOR SCHOOL ENSEMBLES

ENSEMBLES FOR STRINGS

String Ensemble

Mid-to-large-sized chamber orchestra (30-40 players) that develops ensemble, instrumental and sight-reading skills performing intermediate arrangements of art music.

Sinfonietta - Intermediate

Mid to large sized chamber orchestra (25-35 players) that develops ensemble, instrumental and sight reading skills to a high standard performing intermediate to advanced arrangements of art music.

Philharmonia Orchestra - Intermediate

The Philharmonia Orchestra is a large orchestra which performs a range of repertoire from arrangements of popular and music theatre standards to art music (Classical to Contemporary compositions).

Camerata - Advanced

Small to mid-sized chamber orchestra (20-30 players) that develops high level ensemble skills and performs a range of advanced art music canon/repertoire ranging from Baroque to Contemporary compositions.

Symphony Orchestra - Advanced

The Symphony Orchestra is Abbotsleigh's flagship ensemble with entry by audition or invitation. String players must be involved in a string ensemble to be eligible for the Symphony Orchestra. The orchestra performs a range of repertoire from arrangements of popular and music theatre standards to the art music canon (Classical to Contemporary compositions).

Tour String Orchestra - Extension

Project based small chamber orchestra (20 players) that develops a full program of advanced repertoire for performance on a biannual overseas concert tour.

Chamber Ensembles - Extension

In addition to large ensembles, intermediate and advanced students are invited to participate in a chamber ensemble, such as a string quartet or

piano trio. These ensembles focus on specific instrumental skills and study repertoire that requires each student to hold an individual part.

ENSEMBLES FOR WOODWIND, BRASS AND PERCUSSION

Ensemble Class - Beginner

Small group lessons which focus on consolidating basic instrumental skills, fundamentals of ensemble skills and sight-reading development.

Chamber Ensembles - Intermediate

In addition to large ensembles, intermediate and advanced students are invited to participate in a chamber ensemble. These ensembles focus on specific instrumental skills and study repertoire that requires each student to hold an individual part. These include Flute Ensemble, Clarinet Ensemble, Saxophone Ensemble, Recorder Consort, Middle School Brass Belles, Senior Brass Ensemble, Percussion Ensemble, Rock Band, and Guitar Ensemble.

Senior School Concert Band – Intermediate

A medium sized concert band which develops ensemble skills in an intermediate, multi-part repertoire, ranging across pop music, film music and art music.

Wind Band - Intermediate to advanced

Mid to large concert band for advancing students, continuing to develop higher-level instrumental, ensemble and sight reading skills in varied styles of multi-part repertoire.

Jazz Band - Advanced

Jazz big band (10-15 members) that develops high level ensemble skills in jazz repertoire including improvisation and chord realisation.

Symphonic Winds - Advanced

Abbotsleigh's large symphonic concert band is an award-winning ensemble that develops high level ensemble skills in advanced repertoire (classical, chorales, marches and popular repertoire range). Students receive extensive performance opportunities both within and outside the School and represent Abbotsleigh at state and national levels.

Tour Band - Advanced

A project based symphonic band that develops a full program of advanced repertoire for performance, musical exchange and band clinic on a biennial overseas concert tour.

Philharmonia Orchestra – Intermediate

The Philharmonia Orchestra is a large orchestra which performs a range of repertoire from arrangements of popular and music theatre standards to art music (Classical to Contemporary compositions).

Symphony Orchestra – Advanced

The Symphony Orchestra is Abbotsleigh's flagship ensemble with entry by audition or invitation. The orchestra performs a range of repertoire from arrangements of popular and music theatre standards to the art music canon (Classical to Contemporary compositions).

ENSEMBLES FOR VOCALISTS

Senior School Choir

Senior School Choir is Abbotsleigh's largest choir with more than 100 girls in attendance each year and is open to all girls from Years 7-12. The choir develops the ensemble skills, musical knowledge and performance skills of its members through a wide range of repertoire extending from Baroque to contemporary music.

Rock Band - Intermediate to advanced

Abbotsleigh's Rock Band is an award winning ensemble that is driven by the students with expert staff facilitating key instrumental and technology skills, as well as performance opportunities. Musicians who are involved develop skills in acoustic guitar, electric guitar, bass guitar, keyboard, drumkit and vocals.

Vocal Ensemble – Advanced

Vocal Ensemble is a small to medium choir (20-30 singers) open to girls in Years 7-9 with entry by audition or invitation. Its repertoire consists of musical theatre, jazz, a capella and contemporary music aimed towards building ensemble skills, vocal technique and performance skills.

Chamber Choir - Advanced

Chamber Choir is a small to medium choir (20- 30 singers) open to girls in Years 10-12 with entry by audition or invitation. Its advanced range of repertoire is aimed towards building ensemble skills, vocal technique and performance skills, and includes both classical and contemporary styles.

Vox 12 - Extension

A 12-voice a capella choir that offers advanced vocal students chamber and conducting opportunities. Students are coached to take on leadership roles within the group, choosing repertoire, taking rehearsals and conducting public performances.

Tour Choir - Extension

This is a medium sized choir of approximately 40 girls that develops a full program of advanced repertoire for performance on a concert tour, with a focus on contemporary pieces by Australian composers. It offers extensive performance opportunities within Abbotsleigh, outside the School and abroad on concert tour, and significantly builds the ensemble and performance skills of participants. Entry to this choir is by audition or invitation.

JUNIOR SCHOOL ENSEMBLES

Girls wishing to join a Junior School ensemble must also take private lessons at school or externally and will be involved in an audition process to place them in a suitable ensemble.

ENSEMBLES FOR STRINGS

Bambini Strings

This ensemble is for string players in Years 1 and 2. Rehearsals focus on learning fundamental ensemble skills when performing with other string instruments. No audition is required, however, readiness for this ensemble will be assessed and confirmed by string staff.

Poole House Strings - Beginner

In Poole House Strings, students are taught and encouraged to be more musically independent by performing repertoire in a string ensemble setting. There is an emphasis on the ability to sight read fluently and accurately while developing listening skills to play as a cohesive ensemble.

Robinson Strings - Intermediate

This ensemble provides a platform for more experienced instrumentalists to continue to develop their ensemble playing skills. There is an emphasis on developing a strong tone, a range of dynamics, precise bowing and accurate rhythm and intonation.

Symphony Orchestra - Advanced

This is the Junior School's advanced ensemble designed to refine individual and group skills. This orchestra provides a high-level performance opportunity to enable more advanced repertoire to be

performed with the aim of extending and developing musical independence.

Chamber Ensembles - Extension

In addition to large ensembles, intermediate and advanced students may be invited to participate in a chamber string ensemble. These ensembles focus on specific instrumental skills and repertoire that require each student to confidently hold an individual part. Entry to these ensembles is by invitation and is based on ability as well as participation and contribution to one of the larger ensembles previously listed.

ENSEMBLES FOR WOODWIND, BRASS AND PERCUSSION

Beginner Band

This ensemble focuses on learning fundamental ensemble skills in how to work with other musicians in a concert band setting. All girls learning a band instrument are welcome to join Beginner Band. No audition is required to join this ensemble.

Bundarra Band - Intermediate

Bundarra Band is an intermediate level ensemble which provides students with an opportunity to continue to develop and build their ensemble and musicianship skills.

Concert Band - Advanced

Concert Band is the Junior School's advanced level band which aims to refine individual and group skills. This ensemble provides students with an opportunity to perform high level repertoire while continuing to develop ensemble and technical skills.

Symphony Orchestra - Advanced

This is the Junior School's advanced ensemble designed to refine individual and group skills. This orchestra provides a high-level performance opportunity to enable more advanced repertoire to be performed with the aim of extending and developing musical independence.

Woodwind, brass and percussion ensembles - Extension

In addition to large ensembles, intermediate and advanced students

are invited to participate in a small instrumental ensemble. These ensembles focus on specific instrumental skills and study repertoire that requires each student to hold an individual part. Entry to these ensembles is by invitation and is based on ability as well as participation and contribution to one of the larger ensembles listed previously.
