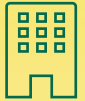

Abbotsleigh Foundation increases focus on sustainability

The Foundation provides financial support for scholarships, prizes and contributions to capital projects. This level of support is only possible through the donations received and the prudent investment of those funds. Just as the support provided by the Foundation is an investment in the future of Abbotsleigh students, the Foundation Board is also investing for the future – a future that is rapidly changing and full of challenge and opportunity.

Recently, the Board's Investment and Finance committee (IFC) reviewed the policies around responsible investing against the backdrop of community expectations and supporting girls' education at Abbotsleigh.

The review considered a number of approaches within Responsible Investing (RI) including:

- ESG Integration
 - Considering Environmental, Social and corporate Governance (ESG) factors, both risks and opportunities, in the investment process.
- Ethical or socially responsible investing
 - Investments which incorporate ethical and/or other values-based considerations, e.g. Exclusions/negative screening.
- Sustainability investing
 - Investments that target companies with sustainable business practices and products, e.g. Best of Sector, positive screening.
- Impact investing
 - Investments that seek to achieve targeted environmental and social outcomes in addition to financial returns, e.g. Green bonds.

In order to achieve RI policy outcomes Foundation references the following principles:

1. The Foundation should increase the focus on RI to better promote positive change through the entities we invest in and also manage the growing number of ESG related risks;
2. Given the primary objective of the Foundation, any additional parameters on RI should not lower the expected risk adjusted returns from the portfolio; and
3. The Foundation should be targeting solutions that focus on Positive Screening and Sustainable Investments.

Consistent with these principles the IFC worked with the Foundation's adviser to review the current portfolio and identify new opportunities.

Following are some examples of how these new investments are contributing to sustainability.

Alignment to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)

In placing companies in their portfolio some of the Foundation managers now look to ensure that they contribute to sustainable development and make a net-positive impact to a more sustainable future.

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are the globally agreed set of goals for all countries to meet the UN 2030 agenda for sustainable development and link to other global sustainability objectives like the Paris Agreement. They provide a desired end point for the 17 goals through 169 targets. While they were created for policy makers rather than investors it is possible to map investments to the SDGs and assess how companies are contributing to the goals.



Scholarship funds

DGR Endorsed Scholarships Fund

The Abbotsleigh Foundation manages this fund which supports means-tested Abbotsleigh Foundation Scholarships and Indigenous Scholarships. Foundation Scholarships are provided annually to students by providing 50% off tuition for Years 10, 11 and 12. In 2021, the Foundation funded six Foundation Scholarships. The Indigenous Scholarships have been provided at Abbotsleigh since 2008 and with philanthropic support and investment, the Abbotsleigh Foundation supports up to three Indigenous scholars per year group, a total of 13, and aims to perpetually endow these scholarships.

This fund is also used to manage and invest gifts to support the Kathleen McCredie Scholarship, a means-tested scholarship awarded to a student who demonstrates all round involvement in the areas of spirituality, service, culture, sport and academia to have the benefit of an education at Abbotsleigh.

All these scholarships provide an Abbotsleigh education to a girl who would not otherwise have had the opportunity. Donations to this fund are tax deductible.

General Scholarships Fund

This fund supports scholarships for the Abbotsleigh community that are available as a result of very special gifts; the Royle and Everett Scholarships are examples of this. In addition, this fund receives endowments for prizes that are awarded at the School's Speech Day.



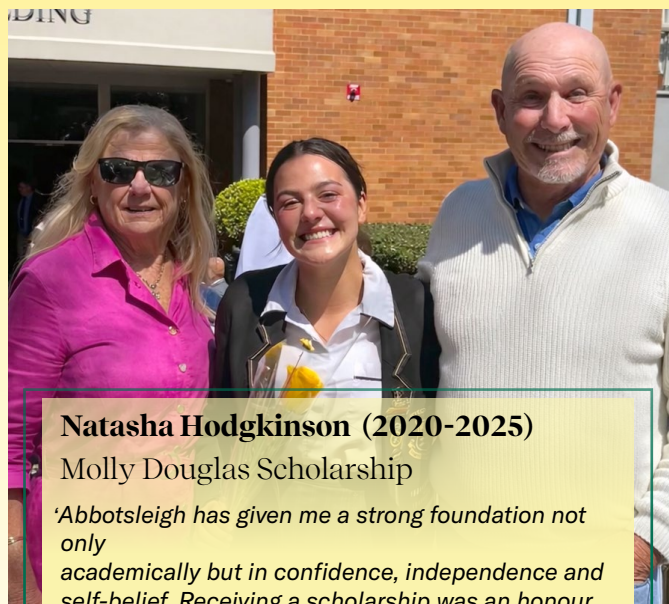
Olivia Oakeshott (2018-2023)

On Saturday 16 August 2025, the Abbotsleigh community came together for an unforgettable evening of celebration and connection at the *Bee Connected* Gala Dinner, held at the beautiful Doltone House, Darling Island. Guests enjoyed a night of community spirit and remarkable generosity – a fitting tribute to Abbotsleigh’s 140th anniversary and the Year 12 theme of ‘Bee Connected’.

With 220 parents, Old Girls, staff and event sponsors in attendance, the evening opened with a vibrant student saxophone ensemble during the drinks reception. The event was hosted by Old Girls Edwina Bartholomew (2000) and Laura Tunstall (2000), whose energy and humour truly made the night memorable.

A highlight was hearing from two inspiring Old Girls whose journeys reflect the life-changing impact of philanthropy at Abbotsleigh: Sophia Darney (2004), past Indigenous Scholarship recipient, and Rani West (2016), past Kathleen McCredie Scholarship recipient.

Rani reflected on how receiving a scholarship impacted her:

‘It genuinely changed my life. I would not be where I am today without attending Abbotsleigh. It fostered my confidence. It fostered my growth. It’s made me into the person I am today.’

Guests took part in a vibrant silent auction, a high-energy live auction led by Duncan Schieb, and a moving live donation paddle-raiser supporting the Indigenous Scholarship Program. Thanks to extraordinary generosity, the Gala raised \$281,710 – the most successful fundraising gala in Abbotsleigh history. This achievement has the potential to support 12 Indigenous Scholarship students, opening doors to transformative educational opportunities.

Abbotsleigh Foundation 2025 Giving Day

On Thursday 5 November 2025, the Abbotsleigh community united for an inspiring day of generosity during the Abbotsleigh Foundation's fifth annual Giving Day, *Bee Connected*. From 8 am-8 pm, parents, Old Girls and staff came together with a shared purpose, raising an extraordinary \$340,672 to help create greater opportunities in girls' education.

The impact of this remarkable result is significant. It could fund two Kathleen McCredie Scholarship students from Year 10 through to Year 12 and support nearly five Indigenous Scholarship students for a full year. Because of this generosity, more girls will have the opportunity to experience the life changing gift of an Abbotsleigh education – a legacy that will shape futures for years to come.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to the 17 generous matchers whose support made the day possible. Their commitment meant that every donation was tripled, amplifying the impact of each gift. We are also immensely grateful to the 359 donors who contributed on the day – a record breaking number that reflects the strength and spirit of our community.

A true highlight of Giving Day was connecting directly with our community by phone. Parents, Board members, Committee members and Old Girls generously volunteered their time alongside our team, reaching out throughout the day. Hearing the encouragement and shared belief in the Foundation's mission was deeply heartening.

Over the years, Giving Day has raised \$1,729,819, enabling the Foundation to enhance learning environments such as the Junior and Senior School libraries and provide means tested scholarships, including the Indigenous Scholarship. These funds continue to expand access to an Abbotsleigh education and the many opportunities it provides.
